Dear Dr. Schultz:

The North Carolina Medical Board (“Board”) has decided to issue you a medical license. However, as a result of information reviewed while evaluating your license application, the Board has also decided to issue you a public letter of concern. The Board does not consider a public letter of concern to be a disciplinary action or a limitation or restriction on your license.

The Board is concerned that you received two Letters of Admonition from the Colorado Medical Board (“Colorado Board”), the first in 2014 and the second in 2022.

The first Letter of Admonition, the details of which are contained therein, involved your treatment and care of Patient A, who had suffered head trauma from a skiing accident. You were the trauma surgeon on call and were asked by the ER physician to consult. In reviewing your care of the patient, the Colorado Board had concerns that you may have failed to promptly order a repeat head CT scan in a high risk, anticoagulated patient and reexamine the patient after there was a change in her mental status.

The second Letter of Admonition, the details of which are contained therein, involved a misdemeanor conviction in 2020 for second-degree criminal tampering.

The Board is concerned about these two letters of admonition. The Board urges you to take steps to ensure the conduct giving rise to the Board’s concerns does not happen again. Otherwise, the Board may take additional action against your North Carolina license to practice medicine. If that happens, this letter may be reviewed in determining the appropriate action.

This letter is a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the North Carolina General Statutes and is subject to public inspection and dissemination as required by that law. It will be reported to the Federation of State Medical Boards.

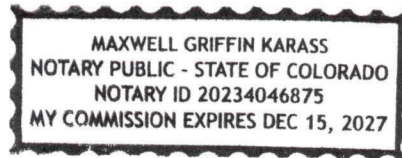
